1951 to date

Seven suburban Chicago mothers began this international organization in 1956 to promote the awareness of breast feeding as a counter to the current medical recommendations. Collection includes information on the relationship of the medical profession to women's health issues. Current records detail involvement of LLLI with outreach to developing nations and their work with women's rights.
